May we be true examples of Christ in the world. I share the prayer below that we prayed to start the school day one morning in November. It has been a source of inspiration to me this Advent, and I hope it can be for you too.

> Dear God, I give thanks for the opportunities to love that present themselves in the turmoil of life. Let us seek to make each other's wellbeing the object of our concern. Let us seek to be present to each other's pain, hear each other's sadness, celebrate each other's success, and allow each other's story to change our own. Amen.

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### ACADEMIC UPDATES

**SECOND QUARTER PROGRESS REPORTS** – Progress report grades for the second quarter closed on Friday, December 11. Updated progress reports will be emailed from RenWeb on Saturday, December 19. Please review these reports for specific information about grades. Are assignments being submitted (0 out of "points possible" is a big clue)? Are assignments being turned in on time (look for half the "points possible")? How are your children doing on quizzes and tests? There is still plenty of time for students to improve their grades before the semester ends <u>if they take a very serious approach</u> to address deficiencies. Exams are scheduled for the last week of the semester, January 19-22. **The first semester closes on Friday, January 22, 2021, three weeks after we return from Christmas break. Upon our return in January, teachers will cover additional coursework, give tests (which will be calculated in second quarter grades) and administer exams which will affect the first semester average.** As of today, if students are not where they want to be (or should be) academically, time remains for students to improve grades.

**FIRST SEMESTER EXAM SCHEDULE** – As you know, this year's exams have been postponed until January. The schedule for exams is included below. Please note that students will have 2 weeks of classes upon their return to school after Christmas break before their week of exams. During those weeks, teachers will cover new material, make graded assignments, and help students prepare for exams. The semester ends on Friday, January 22. All classes have exams and exams must be taken at the scheduled times. If we have a two-hour delay due to weather, we will start that day's exams at 10 a.m. and school will be dismissed at 1:15 p.m. If school is cancelled on any exam day due to weather, exams for that day will take place on the *next day the school is open*. IN THE EVENT OF ANY WEATHER-RELATED CHANGES, CHECK THE SCHOOL WEBSITE, WATCH FOR A PARENT ALERT TEXT, OR FOLLOW THE SCHOOL'S TWITTER FEED FOR UP-TO-THE-MINUTE INFORMATION. Students should prepare for exams by reviewing past tests and quizzes, using study guides, rereading notes and homework/class assignments, reworking math problems, and so on. First semester report cards will be mailed no later than Friday, February 5, 2021.

### **COVID COMMUNICATION UPDATES**

<u>COVID EXPOSURE REPORTING</u>- As West Virginia and Kanawha County continue to experience a surge in COVID-19 cases, communication between home and school becomes even more important. To streamline communication efforts, we have created a new email address health@charlestoncatholic-crw.org to be used if you learn of an exposure of your student or a household member after school hours. Please use this email address to report COVID-19 exposures, positive tests, or questions. Please call the school office at 304-342-8415 and speak with an administrator if you learn of the exposure during school office hours.

<u>ABSENCES-</u> Virtual participation has been designed to support our students who are ill and to encourage students to stay home if they are sick so that we can keep our school community healthy. Planning for virtual learning, in addition to in person learning, requires significant time and effort from the teachers. Therefore, it should be utilized primarily in the cases of illness, exposure, or injury. Students who miss school for reasons other than illness should contact a school administrator for approval prior to virtual participation. Students who are ill with any symptoms should stay home from school. If your child will be absent from school, please communicate with the school office as soon as possible in the morning. You may email the office at appointments@charlestoncatholic-crw.org or begin calling the office as early as 7:15 to make us aware of an absence so we can prepare. Middle school starts class at 7:45 and high school starts at 8:00. Letting us know before school starts will help make the day go more smoothly for everyone!

**RETURN TO SCHOOL GUIDELINES AND VIRTUAL PARTICIPATION-** Students who are ill will remain out of school for 3 days with improving symptoms. A negative COVID test or documentation of another condition (eg. strep throat, ear infection) from the student's physician will be required for a student to return to school. Students may attend school virtually for the days they are home if they are well enough and the office has been notified by a parent prior to the student logging on. Students who are sent home sick during the school day will follow the guidelines for three days of improving symptoms and a negative COVID test or documentation of another condition to return. **Students who leave during the school day will NOT participate virtually for the remainder of that day. They may begin to participate virtually on their first full day of the absence.** If a student misses class due to illness, it is important that he/she touches base with the teacher <u>and</u> checks Google Classroom for make up work. Students should not assume that all classes will be recorded.

**2021-2022 SCHEDULING FOR CURRENTLY ENROLLED STUDENTS** –Scheduling/ registration for the 2021-22 school year will start shortly after we return from break. Registration forms for returning students will be distributed to students in early March. Please note that there are changes in our format and events to accommodate safety protocols for COVID-19. Applications for all grade levels will be available online (www.charlestoncatholic-crw.org) after January 1, 2021. Applications will be completed and submitted online. Detailed instructions are available on the CCHS website.

Virtual Admissions Open Houses for Prospective Parents will be held via Google Meet. Each session will include a meeting with Mrs. Hoyer and Mrs. Herrick and an opportunity for questions and answers. Times and dates are included below.

**Monday, February 22** – deadline for receipt of applications of students currently attending Catholic schools who wish to be given <u>first consideration</u>. Applications from area Catholic schools received after this date lose "first consideration" status and are placed in the general pool of applicants.

Tuesday, February 23 - first day applications will be processed from students in non-Catholic schools

Monday, March 1– deadline for all non-Catholic school students to submit applications who want to be considered in the first round of acceptances

**Friday, March 12** – first round of acceptance letters mailed (for applicants whose files are completed by March 1 – applications received after March  $1^{st}$  will be reviewed periodically by the Admissions Committee and notification as to enrollment status will be mailed at that time)

**NOTE** – It is rare for CCHS to accept students as juniors and seniors. Only juniors and seniors moving into the area will be considered.

# MIDDLE SCHOOL UPDATES

<u>MIDDLE SCHOOL EXAMS</u> – All Charleston Catholic students take semester exams. However, they serve an instructional purpose for our middle school students, helping them learn how to study for and take exams so they are better prepared for high school. For this reason, middle school exams make up only a small percentage of the overall grade. In fact, sixth grade exams are included in the second quarter grade and do not count as a separate calculation in semester grades. <u>Quarter grades</u> provide a more accurate assessment of your child's progress. Help your children prepare for exams by encouraging them to study over a period of time rather than cramming the night before the test. Also, to assist your children in doing their best, please make sure they have adequate rest and a good breakfast before coming to school each day.

# FROM THE SCHOOL OFFICE

**PARENT-TEACHER CONFERENCES** – Many thanks to all of the parents who scheduled time to meet with their children's teachers on our first virtual conference day last month. Though it was a long day for teachers, conferences are an important means of collaboration and partnership between home and school. Communication and working together to support our young people are critical. This year, teachers held a remarkable 1,166 appointments during conference time. Wow!

<u>VIRTUS</u> – Be sure you're on board to help! All parents or other adults who volunteer, coach, drive students, chaperone, etc., are required by the Diocese to complete the diocesan sexual abuse awareness training before being allowed to work with our students. Training is available online. To begin, visit the VirtusOnline.org and choose the online option. Allow 1- $1\frac{1}{2}$  hours to complete the program. Print out the certificate of completion and submit it to Mr. Villers. It is still necessary to complete the background check and sexual abuse awareness statement which can be done by clicking on the link at the school website at www.charlestoncatholic-crw.org. If you have questions, please call Mr. Villers.

Adults who volunteer, coach, or chaperone, may be asked to update background and policy forms. Background checks must be updated every three to five years depending on your role in the school. Policy questionnaires should be updated if they were signed before 2014. Current Diocese guidelines do not require volunteers to update the training portion of VIRTUS. Please contact Mr. Villers with any questions and to update your forms.

<u>UNIFORMS</u> – Christmas break is a great time to check the "health" of uniforms. Check to make sure that pant hems are not frayed, that colors are not washed out, that uniforms still fit, etc. Please make sure that your children are properly attired when they leave home.

**PROOF OF ENROLLMENT FORMS** -- for drivers' licenses and permits may be requested from the school office using the appointments@charlestoncatholic-crw.org email address. Please put PROOF OF ENROLLMENT REQUEST in the subject line. Include student's full legal name (no nicknames), date of birth MM/DD/YYYY), and home address in the request. It will take two school days for the forms to be completed by office staff.

<u>APPOINTMENTS</u> -- We strongly encourage you to make doctor's appointments after the school day so that students do not miss valuable instructional time. However, we know that this is not always possible. If your child must leave school for an appointment during the school day, <u>PLEASE EMAIL THE APPOINTMENT DETAILS TO THE SCHOOL AT</u> appointments@charlestoncatholic-crw.org by 8:30 a.m. The student will NOT come to the office before 8 a.m. to get an appointment slip. The office will update this information in the daily report. If a student is being picked up by a parent/guardian, the parent will call the office upon their arrival and the office staff will call to the student's class to dismiss them. If a student is checking him/herself out for an appointment, he/she will come to the office to sign out before leaving. All students will need to enter through the new main entrance (double glass doors on Virginia Street, Commons entrance) when they return to be screened for reentry.

**RENWEB UPDATES** – We continue to use RenWeb as a valuable communication tool, so please make sure the demographic information you have entered is accurate. We use this data to generate address labels for any school mailings, as well as for email addresses which have become a vital means of communication. Please update any medical information that we need to have regarding your child as well. We use the Parent Alert Communication component of RenWeb for important messages, too, such as any school closings or notifications from the office. These alerts will come as a text message to your phone so it is also important that we have a current cell phone number.

<u>WANT YOUR PHOTOS IN THE YEARBOOK?</u> – This year has presented challenges in acquiring photos for the yearbook. We need your help! You can share photos of sporting events and practices, school & community events, or e-learning photos. Start sharing today! **IF YOUR LAST NAME IS DIFFERENT FROM YOUR CHILD'S NAME** – please put the child's full name on all checks issued to CCHS and to any correspondence sent to the school.

**SAFETY REMINDER** – Our students feel safe and comfortable in downtown Charleston, which is a benefit of our location. However, it is important that they maintain situational awareness. They should be aware of their surroundings when walking to and from parking lots or to parents' offices or the library after school. It is important for them to be focused on what's happening around them and not lost in their phones! Students should travel in pairs or small groups when possible. If approached by adults who they don't know, students should get out of the conversations as quickly as possible and should avoid sharing any personal information. Please have this conversation with your children to remind them of safety precautions they should take.

1) SAT and ACT testing and registration information is available online at --

www.collegeboard.org and www.act.org (CCHS code: 490-205). All juniors should take each test at least once this year.

2) **Junior and senior parents** – if you have not been receiving Mrs. Herrick's updates about college visits, scholarships, etc., please email her at andrea.herrick@charlestoncatholic-crw.org to be added to her list.

3) **College Visits**: Mrs. Herrick handles college visit requests. Students should pick up the forms from her office and return the completed forms to her at least 2 days before the trip. Seniors are allowed 2 college visit days; juniors are allowed 2 college visit days. All college visits must be made before May 1.

4) **FINE ARTS/HUMANITIES REQUIREMENTS** – All students should submit their fine art/humanities critiques using the Google Form posted to their English teachers' Google Classrooms. Paper forms will no longer be accepted. If you have any questions, please contact your child's English teacher.

5) **The PROMISE Scholarship Application** (www.cfwv.com/promise) and **2021-2022 FAFSA** (www.fafsa.gov) are now available; both are due by March 1, 2021. Seniors must apply by the March 1 deadline, even if they do not currently meet the test score or GPA requirements. The PROMISE application and tutorial link are available at cfwv.com/promise. Throughout this pandemic, we have seen students striving to fill their community service responsibilities and we applaud their efforts. We want to continue to encourage students in these actions. At the same time, we recognize that it can be especially challenging to find service opportunities, while keeping ourselves and others safe. To accommodate the challenges of the pandemic, service requirements for the 2020-21 have been adjusted and are outlined below.

1.) Our social distancing measures today are to protect all of us, especially the vulnerable among us. The service that we often call "special needs" is service to those who are particularly vulnerable in our community. Mask-wearing, social distancing and travel changes are in-and-of-themselves service to the vulnerable. For this reason, for this year, students will only need to have one activity of special needs community service.

2.) Students may include acts of service for their grandparent(s) as community service. Calling or visiting

grandparents would *not* be considered community service. Examples of service for grandparents are making a meal for them, shoveling their walk, or grocery shopping for them. There is no limit on the number of hours that can be earned in service to a grandparent.

3.) Service may be earned in as many, or as few, service sites are needed.

4.) For questions about community service, students should speak with their theology teacher or with Mrs. Linehan Belcher.

### COMMUNITY SERVICE AND GIVING

**CLAY COUNTY CHRISTMAS PROJECT**— This past Saturday, we celebrated our annual Christmas tradition of delivering presents to Clay County. While we did not have a Christmas party this year, we were still able to maintain the spirit of the project and to serve our neighbors. Stockings, food, and presents came into school last week as classrooms, the Commons, and the gym became corners of Santa's workshop, and everyone in our community had an important role to play. Teachers bagged and labeled presents so that they would be organized and ready for distribution in Clay. A group of senior volunteers packed the trucks after school on Friday with food boxes, stockings, and gifts from CCHS, and additional food boxes from Sacred Heart Grade School. On Saturday morning, a small group of volunteers arrived at Risen Lord Church in Maysel to unload the trucks and organize the presents. Once everything was unloaded, Charleston Catholic's volunteers returned to Charleston and the volunteers from Risen Lord Church took over to run the drive by distribution that took place on Saturday afternoon. Kathi Linkenogger organized her volunteers and worked to make sure that all families received their presents. She and the Risen Lord parishioners have partnered with CCHS for almost 30 years to plan and carry out the project. This year, the Charleston Catholic community reached 139 families with approximately 400 children, an important way for our community to serve our neighbors.

This annual service would not be possible without the support of the entire CCHS community, students, families, faculty and staff, and others. The true spirit of Christmas is on display when standing in a room surrounded by the wrapped presents, stockings, and food items that have been selflessly been brought to school. We also thank the <u>Sacred Heart Grade</u> School children, their families, and faculty and staff who continued their tradition of involvement by providing over 150 food boxes for distribution to families at the party. Additional thanks go out to Dickinson Gould (CCHS class of 1995 and current CCHS parent), president of Buzz Food Service, for donating trucks and drivers (and for driving a truck himself!) to transport the goods to the party in Maysel. We also thank Sherry Shindle and David Hoffmann for all of their work "behind the scenes," organizing and entering data, processing information on the children and their families, and preparing the lists that keep the entire operation moving smoothly both at the school-level and during the party. We thank Meredith Aubel for coordinating the logistics of collecting, packing and organizing all of the gifts. <u>The commitment and support from the school community is what makes this project work</u>.

### HANDBOOOK REMINDERS

<u>MEDICATION</u>-- Any student taking medication, prescription or over-the-counter, during school hours must report this to the school office. Students taking medication during school hours must have a Diocesan form on file in the school office. **Medication is to be given to the office staff who will dispense it at times designated on the permission slip.** All medications in the office will be returned to students at the end of the year. Medications are not kept from year to year.

<u>PARTICIPATION IN EXTRACURRICULAR ACTIVITIES</u>— In order to participate in extracurricular activities on a particular day, <u>a student must be in school for the FULL DAY on the day of the event</u>. This "full day" policy includes appointments, so students need to avoid scheduling appointments during the school day. Students who have long-standing medical appointments, family funerals, or similar instances may be excused at the discretion of the Assistant Principal for Operations. Additionally, students must be at school for the majority of the school day in order to be eligible for practice. Students are also expected to <u>be on time on days following athletic events</u>. If a student is suspended at school, that student is also suspended from athletic practices, games, etc. for the FULL DAY on the day(s)

suspended (i.e., if a student is suspended for a Tuesday, the suspension includes involvement in any school activities -- sports, social, etc. -- for Tuesday evening also).
