ACADEMIC UPDATES

FIRST SEMESTER REPORT CARDS – were mailed today. Semester grades are composed of first quarter grades and second quarter grades. The quarter with the higher grade was weighted 60% of the semester grade and the lower grade was weighted 40%. When you examine your child's current report card, please note that quarter GPAs are reported at the bottom of each quarter's column. The semester GPA, calculated using current semester grades, is located at the bottom of the semester average column and is recorded on a student's middle school or high school transcript. As it appears on the high school report card, the GPA is weighted. However, the unweighted semester GPA is used for extracurricular eligibility determination. The cumulative GPA(noted on high school report cards only), reported at the lower right under the teacher comments, is the cumulative grade point average for all high school semesters. Please note each of these details.

TRANSCRIPTS AND REPORT CARDS – At this time of year, there is a lot of talk about grades being recorded on a transcript. It is important for you to know what is included in a transcript. In addition to demographic information (e.g., address, phone, birthdates, etc.), academic and attendance information is recorded. CCHS does not include students' Social Security numbers on transcripts. Students' courses are listed by grade level and semester grades for each course are included with a letter grade and a number grade. Quarter, exam, and conduct grades are NOT included on the transcript. Only high school courses are recorded on the transcript that will be sent to colleges during a student's senior year.

PROMOTION POLICY – A review of the CCHS promotion policy is in order, now that first semester grades are official.

- 1.) All students (grades 6-12) must pass both semesters of <u>theology</u> in order to be promoted to the next grade level in June. The required number of community service hours and fine arts/humanities credits must also be completed before being granted a diploma or before being readmitted for the next school year.
- 2.) Promotion to the next grade is granted when a student earns credit for each semester's courses.
- 3.) Students who fail courses must enroll in CCHS-approved summer school programs during the summer following the failure to make up the credit if they wish to remain at CCHS. Students failing more than two semesters in one school year may be placed on academic probation or may not be readmitted to CCHS for the following school year.
- 4.) 4. In 6th, 7th, and 8th grade students must earn a total of 7 credits each year. To be classified as a sophomore, a student must have earned 7 credits, 14 credits to be considered a junior, and 21 credits a senior.

MAP TESTING—This year we will bypass the winter round of MAP testing for the majority of our sixth through tenth graders. Because of the back and forth nature of the school year, we would like to spend as much time as possible focused on instruction. We will offer MAP testing though to our eighth graders in science (which will be administered during a science class period) and to students who were unable to test in the fall. The testing window closes March 5, so we are finalizing testing details and will be in touch with eligible students and their families in the coming weeks. All sixth through tenth graders will participate in the end of the year MAP testing in late April.

RENWEB REMINDERS

<u>RENWEB CONTACT INFORMATION</u> –If any of your demographic information changes or if you are not receiving weekly RenWeb emails with grade reports, please update your demographic information in RenWeb. Log in to ParentsWeb through RenWeb and update your contact information by choosing "WebForms" under "School Information." Address, phone number, and email information is located in the family demographic form. If you have questions or need assistance, please call the school office.

RENWEB BEST PRACTICES—As we begin the second semester, students get a fresh start with their grades in their courses. It is important to have a healthy knowledge of and discussion about students' grades. RenWeb grade emails

offer increased knowledge to parents. However, sometimes this knowledge can translate to additional stress on students. Below please find some ideas that might help RenWeb be a beneficial experience for your family.

1. Monitor grades weekly. Facilitate discussion.

By checking in weekly with RenWeb, parents are able to get the big picture of their child's week at school. Talk about what you see together. What did you learn this week? What did you do well? What did you find challenging? Were your study habits for the week successful? Do your study habits need to be adjusted for the upcoming week? Look for areas of strength and weakness.

2. Empower your child.

If your child has a question about a grade or a misunderstood concept, encourage him or her to talk to the teacher first. It is important that our children know we support them as they take control of their own learning.

3. Focus on the big picture.

Frequent monitoring of RenWeb places a large amount of unnecessary stress on students. Teachers create many assignments in their classes that allow students to learn and display their learning in varied ways over time. Students need to have the freedom to participate in these various activities independently and to monitor their own daily progress in their classes.

4. Look for patterns.

RenWeb's itemized grade sheet can help you to identify learning and difficulty patterns. Is my child turning in homework? Did he or she earn any zeros this week? Are reading quizzes a problem? Is there a discrepancy between class work and test grades? If you see a pattern on your child's grade sheet, have a conversation about the patterns you see and decide if teacher follow-up, by either you or your child, is needed.

5. Set a time to review grades that works for your family.

While RenWeb grade updates go out at midnight, grade review doesn't have to be the way your family begins Sunday morning. What makes sense for your family? When do you plan for the upcoming week? Can weekly RenWeb grade review, as well as RenWeb Lesson Plan review, fit naturally into this planning time?

















COVID COMMUNICATION UPDATES

COVID EXPOSURE REPORTING- The ongoing and open communication between home and school related to illness and COVID cases and exposures is of utmost importance. Many thanks for keeping us in the loop. If anyone in your household is undergoing COVID screening due to an exposure or illness, please keep your students home until receiving negative test results. Please use health@charlestoncatholic-crw.org to notify the school administration if you learn of an exposure of your student or a household member after school hours. Please use this email address to report COVID-19 exposures, positive tests, or questions. Please call the school office at 304-342-8415 and speak with an administrator if you learn of the exposure during school office hours.

ABSENCES- Virtual participation has been designed to support our students who are ill and to encourage students to stay home if they are sick so that we can keep our school community healthy. Planning for virtual learning, in addition to in person learning, requires significant time and effort from the teachers. Therefore, it should be utilized primarily in the cases of illness, exposure, or injury. Students who miss school for reasons other than illness should contact a school administrator for approval prior to virtual participation. Students who are ill with any symptoms should stay home from school. If your child will be absent from school, please communicate with the school office as soon as possible in the morning. You may email the office at appointments@charlestoncatholic-crw.org or begin calling the office as early as 7:15 to make us aware of an absence so we can prepare. Middle school starts class at 7:45 and high school starts at 8:00. Letting us know before school starts will help make the day go more smoothly for everyone!

RETURN TO SCHOOL GUIDELINES AND VIRTUAL PARTICIPATION- Students who are ill will remain out of school for 3 days with improving symptoms. A negative COVID test or documentation of another condition (eg. strep throat,

ear infection) from the student's physician will be required for a student to return to school. Students may attend school virtually for the days they are home if they are well enough and the office has been notified by a parent prior to the student logging on. Students who are sent home sick during the school day will follow the guidelines for three days of improving symptoms and a negative COVID test or documentation of another condition to return. **Students who leave during the school day will NOT participate virtually for the remainder of that day. They may begin to participate virtually on their first full day of the absence.** If a student misses class due to illness, it is important that he/she touches base with the teacher <u>and</u> checks Google Classroom for make up work. Students should not assume that all classes will be recorded.

TUITION RATES FOR 2021-21—will be released in mid-April and invoices will be mailed at that time.

DIOCESAN TUITION ASSISTANCE— For the thirtieth year, the Diocese of Wheeling-Charleston will continue its tradition of offering the Tuition Assistance Program (TAP) in an effort to keep Catholic school education affordable for Catholic families who desire it but may need some financial assistance to make that dream a reality. Thanks to Most Reverend Mark Brennan's commitment to Catholic education, funds have once again been allocated for distribution to Catholic families in need of assistance. Awards are based upon a family's degree of need relative to all other applicants. Apply on-lineathttps://www.factsmgt.com. Click on "Grant and Aid Assessment" and log in. Have your 2020 tax information available. Families with children currently enrolled or who are applying to enroll for the 2021-2022 school year should apply ASAP. Applications open February 1. The deadline is April 30. No assistance will be available from the Diocese or from any school unless an application and all required documentation is submitted, and the fee has been paid. The application fee is \$35. The Diocese will pay \$17.50 and families must pay \$17.50.

FROM THE SCHOOL OFFICE



PARENT ALERT COMMUNICATION TOOL—Remember that we will be using our Parent Alert text system (a Ren Web component) as a means of communication in addition to the school website (www.charlestoncatholic-crw.org), Twitter feed, and RenWeb email. Make sure your contact information in RenWeb is correct and up to date! Be on the lookout for these texts with important school updates including announcements from the school office AND ALL WEATHER RELATED CLOSINGS/ DELAYS.

<u>VIRTUS</u> – Be sure you're on board to help! All parents or other adults who volunteer, coach, drive students, chaperone, etc., are required by the Diocese to complete the diocesan sexual abuse awareness training before being allowed to work with our students. Training is available online. To begin, visit the VirtusOnline.org and choose the online option. Allow 1- 1½ hours to complete the program. Print out the certificate of completion and submit it to Mr. Villers. It is still necessary to complete the background check and sexual abuse awareness statement which can be done by clicking on the link at the school website at <u>www.charlestoncatholic-crw.org</u>. If you have questions, please call Mr. Villers.

Adults who volunteer, coach, or chaperone, may be asked to update background and policy forms. Background checks must be updated every three to five years depending on your role in the school. Policy questionnaires should be updated if they were signed before 2014. Current Diocese guidelines do not require volunteers to update the training portion of VIRTUS. Please contact Mr. Villers with any questions and to update your forms.

<u>GLOVES NEEDED--</u> The science department is in need of latex and vinyl gloves of all sizes for dissections and other lab activities. Please contact Mrs. Arnold to coordinate a donation or drop off any gloves in the office. Many thanks!

<u>OUTSIDE FORMS</u>- If your child needs to have forms filled out by teachers or other school staff for a physician's evaluation, please send them to the main office with a note. Please note that any form filled out for the purpose of evaluation must be sent directly to a specific doctor or group; forms will not be returned to the child or parent.

<u>IMMUNIZATIONS</u>--The health department asks all schools to keep students' immunization records up to date. If your child has had recent shots, please send CCHS a copy of new health records. All rising 7th graders are required to have a Tdap booster and first meningococcal vaccine <u>before they enter school in August</u>. Rising 12th graders are required to have the second dose of the meningococcal vaccine <u>before they enter school in August</u>. Once your child has these vaccines, an updated immunization record must be submitted to Mrs. McLaughlin.

PROOF OF ENROLLMENT FORMS -- for drivers' licenses and permits may be requested from the school office using the appointments@charlestoncatholic-crw.org email address. Please put PROOF OF ENROLLMENT REQUEST in the subject line. Include student's full legal name (no nicknames), date of birth MM/DD/YYYY), and home address in the request. It will take two school days for the forms to be completed by office staff.

NOTE – It is rare for CCHS to accept students as juniors and seniors. Only juniors and seniors moving into the area will be considered.

NOTES FROM THE ACADEMIC ADVISOR

1.) West Virginia Governor's Schools: The State of West Virginia is proud to offer The Governor's Honors Schools, residential summer sessions for academically and/or artistically talented students from across West Virginia. The programs are based on the premise that West Virginia's youth must be provided with special opportunities for learning and personal development in order for them to realize their full potential. There is no cost to families of students who are accepted to these competitive programs. Those who have attended these programs in the past describe them as "life-changing." Governor's Honors Academy (GHA) - Marshall University (June 28-July 9)

This program offers endless opportunities for the highest achieving rising seniors to live and study with like-minded students in an intellectually stimulating environment. Current juniors may apply. Please let Mrs. Herrick know if you are applying.

Governor's School for the Arts (GSA) - Marshall University (Dates TBD) This program is designed for rising juniors who write, dance, sing, play an instrument, act, draw/paint or work in digital media. Current sophomores may apply. Please let Mrs. Herrick know if you are applying.

All students in the Class of 2021 must complete BOTH the PROMISE and the FAFSA applications in order to be considered for the PROMISE scholarship. Additionally, colleges and universities throughout the country use FAFSA information to determine scholarships and financial aid. Go to www.cfwv.com then Financial Aid Planning. (Note: Please use all zeros for the student ID number.)
- 4.) **SAT and ACT CLASS FOR SOPHOMORES AND JUNIORS**-- "Tricks of the Trade" is Charleston Catholic's very own SAT and ACT prep class. The course is designed by Mrs. Griffith (AP Calculus and AP Physics teacher) and Mrs.Herrick (Academic Advisor and former English teacher) specifically for our students, keeping in mind what they have already learned in class and building upon that knowledge. Students will split the time equally. The course will begin Sunday, March 14, and will run for three weeks meeting from 6-7:15 p.m. via Google Meet. The cost is \$150. CAMPUS MINISTRY

- 1.) Lent of 2021 will be February 17-April 3. On Ash Wednesday, Fr. Binu will bless our ashes which will then be delivered to theology classes. Our theology teachers will have a prayer service in theology class and sprinkle ashes on students' heads. We will be certain to offer petitions for the health and well-being of our community and for an end to the COVID-19 pandemic.

COMMUNITY SERVICE AND GIVING

HOPE 2021 Update – Planning has begun for our 16th summer of HOPE. We will partner again this coming summer with Bill & Addie Likens, who coordinate the Cabwaylingo Appalachian Mission (CAM) in Wayne and Mingo Counties. Due to the current state of the pandemic, our usual June participation is moved to later in the summer. HOPE 2021 is scheduled for the week of August 1-6. Our group of juniors, seniors, college age alumni and adult work team leaders will make significant repairs at the homes of several low income families and seniors. We also plan for some of our volunteers to assist with the construction of a new house for a family. We are committed to raising \$25,000, the amount needed to purchase all the building materials for the construction of the new home. CAM will supplement our fundraising efforts with the materials necessary to complete the repairs on the other houses at which we will work, making these houses warmer, safer, and drier. A slide show of our HOPE experience in the summer of 2019 can be viewed on our school website under the "Community Outreach" tab. The slideshow includes photos of the new house that some of our volunteers helped construct in Mingo County. The house was built for a mom and her two young children.

HANDBOOOK REMINDERS

<u>COLLEGE VISITS</u>- Juniors and seniors are encouraged to visit colleges to help in the college selection process. Juniors and seniors wishing to visit colleges during a scheduled school day will not be penalized for attendance purposes if they do not exceed a total of **2 days for seniors and 2 days for juniors**.

In order to be approved, requests for college visits must be submitted in writing (form in academic advisor's office) at least 48 hours prior to the visit for approval by the academic advisor and principal. Visits must be completed by May 1.

<u>USE OF TECHNOLOGY-</u> Cyberbullying involves the use of technology to support ongoing negative hostile behavior that is intended to harm others. Social media accounts that are associated with a student may be held against them (i.e. fake accounts, spam accounts). Behaviors include, but are not limited to, posting rumors, threats, or hurtful statements on a social networking site, following social networking sites that contain rumors, threats, or hurtful statements, forwarding text or email messages, or posting and/ or reposting tweets that contain rumors, threats,

offensive pictures or videos, pictures or videos containing sexual content, or hurtful statements about another person, and misrepresenting one's self over a technological communication device.


MANY THANKS

SCHOOL CLOSURE INFORMATION

<u>SCHOOL CLOSINGS/DELAYS DUE TO SNOW/ICE</u> – We are in the winter months when snow is possible on any day. Let's be ready! Here's a brief reminder of the CCHS weather policy. <u>Remember that school closings and delays are texted through Parent Alert, are announced on the CCHS website, and are tweeted through cchsnews.</u>

- 1) CCHS/SHGS will NOT follow ANY of the Kanawha County Schools' weather-related procedures.
- 2) Families may connect to the CCHS website or listen to the radio/television for changes to CCHS/SHGS schedules. The following stations will be notified by 6:15 a.m. if there are changes to be made: WV Public Radio, WCHS, WCHS-TV, WSAZ-TV, WOWK TV, V100, 96.1, and WKAZ. The CCHS website will be updated, a tweet will be sent through cchsnews, and a Parent Alert text will be sent. PLANS FOR THE DAY (WHETHER REMOTE LEARNING, E-DAY, OR DAY OFF) WILL BE INCLUDED IN THE ANNOUNCEMENT OF THE CLOSURE.
 - 3) If no announcements are made for CCHS/SHGS, classes will be held on the regular schedule.
- 4) If a two-hour delay is announced, classes will start promptly 2 hours after the normal start time. Middle school classes will start at 9:45 a.m. and high school will start at 10 a.m. The building will not open until 9:30 to give staff time to get to school. Please do not drop off your children before 9:30!
 - 5) As always, if you cannot get your child to school for health or safety reasons, notify the school.



SNOW E-DAY POLICY

Though we hope not to need our "e-day plan," we want to alert our school community to the possibility now. In the event that the e-day policy becomes active, it will be noted on the school website and in the messages (Parent Alert and cchsnews) that announce the school closing.

If the e-day should become necessary, the following plan will be activated:

- 1) By 9 a.m. on days that school is closed, teachers will post instructions for their classes in their Google Classroom.
- 2) <u>Assignments for each class will be about 30 minutes in length</u>. Teachers will keep in mind what materials students would have available at home.
- 3) <u>Completion of each class' assignments is required.</u> Namely, as is the case in a regular instructional day, each e-day assignment counts for a grade in teachers' gradebooks. Failure to complete an assignment will result in a zero for each assignment. Teachers will post details about assignment submission in Google Classroom.
