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ACADEMIC UPDATES

THIRD QUARTER REPORT CARDS WILL BE MAILED APRIL 12— Once we return from Easter Break, report cards will be mailed. Please take some time to review the report card and teacher comments with your children. If you see that your children's third quarter grades are not a reflection of their abilities, discuss with them what changes can be made to make the fourth quarter stronger. The new quarter is an opportunity to start fresh, and they have plenty of time to turn things around for the semester. Use the detailed weekly reports from RenWeb to figure out exactly what is going on. Sometimes, it's just a matter of not turning in assignments on time. Often, it's not spending the time necessary to study for quizzes and tests. Don't accept excuses. This year has been hard and everyone is tired. However,

we will keep working until the end of the year. Learning takes work, and it is important work! Please encourage your children to put forth the effort necessary to achieve their personal best.



REGISTRATION FORMS FOR 2021-22- and fees were due in the office, Friday, March 26. Double check with your child to make sure he/she has turned in the form!

SECOND SEMESTER EXAM SCHEDULE — The end of the quarter marks the halfway point of the second semester. Spring exams will quickly be upon us! All classes have exams and exams must be taken at the scheduled times. Students who miss semester exams for reasons other than illness (who will be given the opportunity to make up the exams) will receive an F for those examinations. Just a reminder regarding the seniors—only exam exemption policy: Seniors may be exempt from second semester exams if: 1) the course is a two-semester course; 2) the teacher chooses to allow exam exemptions; 3) third and fourth quarter grades average to at least a 93%; 4) fine arts requirements must have been completed by Friday, March 26, and community service requirements are due by Friday, May 7, 2021. Students enrolled in AP courses must take the AP exam AND teacher-developed final exams. Seniors who meet exam exemption requirements for their AP classes may be exempt from teacher-developed final exams. Seniors in non-AP classes who choose to take AP exams will also take teacher-developed final exams unless they meet the exemption standards. Non-seniors who choose to take an AP exam for an AP class in which they are not enrolled must take the final exam for their class.

TUITION AND CALENDAR INFORMATION FOR 2021-22

<u>TUITION INVOICES FOR 2021-22</u>—will be released in mid-April. Invoices and loan information from Premier Bank will be mailed on April 15. Once again this year, the tuition invoice will include the general and class fees. If you choose to use a Premier loan, the fees may be included in the loan amount or may be paid separately. **Tuition payment in full is due June 15** (late charge assessed at \$1.00 per day after June 15) and **fee payment is due by the August registration date** (students will not be allowed to pick up their schedules until registration fees are paid). More details will be included in the tuition packet mailed in April.

DIOCESAN TUITION ASSISTANCE— For the thirtieth year, the Diocese of Wheeling-Charleston will continue its tradition of offering the Tuition Assistance Program (TAP) in an effort to keep Catholic school education affordable for Catholic families who desire it but may need some financial assistance to make that dream a reality. Thanks to Most Reverend Mark Brennan's commitment to Catholic education, funds have once again been allocated for distribution to Catholic families in need of assistance. Awards are based upon a family's degree of need relative to all other applicants. Apply on-line at https://www.factsmgt.com. Click on "Grant and Aid Assessment" and log in. Have your 2020 tax information available. Families with children currently enrolled or who are applying to enroll for the 2021-2022 school year should apply ASAP. Applications opened on February 1. The deadline is April 30. No assistance will be available from the Diocese or from any school unless an application and all required documentation is submitted, and the fee has been paid. The application fee is \$35. The Diocese will pay \$17.50 and families must pay \$17.50.

COVID COMMUNICATION UPDATES

COVID EXPOSURE REPORTING- Despite the increased vaccinations in our area, positive COVID cases continue to rise in young people, particularly in the 10-19 age group. It is critical that we continue to practice COVID safety protocols. The ongoing and open communication between home and school related to illness and COVID cases and exposures is of utmost importance. Many thanks for keeping us in the loop. If anyone in your household is undergoing COVID screening due to an exposure or illness, please keep your students home until receiving negative test results. Minimizing potential exposures is an important step in preventing quarantines of significant numbers of students. Please use health@charlestoncatholic-crw.org to notify the school administration if you learn of an exposure of your student or a household member after school hours. Please use this email address to report COVID-19 exposures, positive tests, or questions. Please call the school office at 304-342-8415 and speak with an administrator if you learn of the exposure during school office hours.

ABSENCES- Virtual participation has been designed to support our students who are ill and to encourage students to stay home if they are sick so that we can keep our school community healthy. Planning for virtual learning, in addition to in person learning, requires significant time and effort from the teachers. Therefore, it should be utilized primarily in the cases of illness, exposure, or injury. Students who miss school for reasons other than illness should contact a school administrator for approval prior to virtual participation. Students who are ill with any symptoms should stay home from school. If your child will be absent from school, please communicate with the school office as soon as possible in the morning. You may email the office at appointments@charlestoncatholic-crw.org or begin calling the office as early as 7:15 to make us aware of an absence so we can prepare. Middle school starts class at 7:45 and high school starts at 8:00. Letting us know before school starts will help make the day go more smoothly for everyone!

RETURN TO SCHOOL GUIDELINES AND VIRTUAL PARTICIPATION— Students who are ill will remain out of school for 3 days with improving symptoms. A negative COVID test or documentation of another condition (eg. strep throat, ear infection) from the student's physician will be required for a student to return to school. Students may attend school virtually for the days they are home if they are well enough and the office has been notified by a parent prior to the student logging on. Students who are sent home sick during the school day will follow the guidelines for three days of improving symptoms and a negative COVID test or documentation of another condition to return. Students who leave during the school day will NOT participate virtually for the remainder of that day. They may begin to participate virtually on their first full day of the absence. If a student misses class due to illness, it is important that he/she touches base with the teacher and checks Google Classroom for make up work. Students should not assume that all classes will be recorded. Attendance and return to school guidelines are different for those who have been fully vaccinated. Please make sure to communicate vaccination status to the office in the case of an illness so an administrator can discuss adjustments with you.

TRAVEL- With Spring Break upon us, many families are planning to travel in the next few weeks. Charleston Catholic does not have a travel policy or a mandatory quarantine that will be enforced related to travel. However, travel can increase the risks of spreading COVID and is not recommended by the CDC. If you choose to travel, please be diligent in COVID safety protocols—social distancing, wearing masks when with people other than household members, and handwashing. If you are unable to maintain these protocols, please consider one of the following options: 1) quarantine for 14 days before returning to school or 2) wait five days after your trip, get COVID tested (PCR) and receive negative results prior to coming back to school. Again, these suggestions are requests to keep our community healthy and to do all we can to keep the school building open and as many students in class as possible.

<u>VACCINES</u>- As you know, vaccines have been opened for all West Virginians sixteen and over. The Kanawha Charleston Health Department continues to hold clinics regularly. Appointments can be scheduled by calling the Health Department. Fully vaccinated people are exempt from quarantine after an exposure unless they begin to experience symptoms. That means fully vaccinated students with documentation are able to continue to attend school in person.

NOTES FROM THE ACADEMIC ADVISOR

- 1.) Immunizations—The health department asks all schools to keep students' immunization records up to date. If your child has had recent shots, please send CCHS a copy of new health records. All rising 7th graders are required to have a Tdap booster and first meningococcal vaccine before they enter school in August. Rising 12th graders are required to have the second dose of the meningococcal vaccine before they enter school in August. Once your child has these vaccines, an updated immunization record must be submitted to Mrs. McLaughlin.
- 2.) Reminder Mrs. Herrick handles college visit requests. Students should get the forms from her and return the completed forms to her at least 2 days before the trip. Seniors are allowed 2 college visit days; juniors are allowed 2 college visit days. College visits must be made before May 1.
- 3.) SAT and ACT testing and registration information is available online at -- www.collegeboard.org and www.act.org (CCHS code: 490-205).
- 4.) Juniors will take the SAT School Day test on Tuesday, April 13. Please make sure students are well-rested and well-fed that morning. Students should plan to bring snacks and water with them to school on this day, as they will not be dismissed to lunch. The test takes up to five hours to administer, and students will not attend afternoon classes on this day. If you have any questions, please contact Mrs. Herrick.
- 5.) Juniors should visit colleges (either in-person or virtually) during spring break and/or over the upcoming months. If you visit schools in-person, be sure to pick up literature, talk to admissions personnel, talk to students, look at dorms and classrooms, try the food, meet professors, and ask "Does this atmosphere suit me?"

HANDBOOOK REMINDERS

<u>UNIFORM SHORTS-</u>The time for uniform shorts is almost upon us (beginning April 15). Please take a few moments to review the handbook guidelines for uniform shorts. Navy blue twill shorts must be no higher than 2 inches above the knee. Shorts must not have any visible labeling or rivets. Uniform shorts are not cargo style. Shorts must be worn at the waist and be of modest fit. Shorts must not be faded. Students wearing worn, faded shorts will be considered out of uniform. Shorts are worn from the beginning of the school year until October 15 and beginning April 15 until the end of the school year.

<u>PICK UP AND DROP OFF REFRESHERS</u>- Please keep the following guidelines in mind when dropping off and picking up students. Students must never be dropped off or picked up directly in front of the school on Virginia Street. Drop off or pick up should occur in the blocks before or after the school on Virginia Street or on Leon Sullivan Way in front of the school. Parents must pull to the curb to pick- up or drop off students. Students are also instructed they must only cross the intersection of Leon Sullivan and Virginia Street when the appropriate walk signal is flashing.

ATHLETIC UPDATES

TRAVEL—Students may not drive to school events, such as field trips or "away" athletic events, taking place at locations other than Charleston Catholic facilities or other designated "home" locations. Students must ride to and from the event with adults (age 21 or older) who have met the Diocesan requirements for field trip drivers.

<u>PARTICIPATION IN SCHOOL SPORTS</u> – To participate in athletic events, students must be in school for <u>the full school day</u> on the day of the scheduled activity. If a student is late or absent for any part of the day on a game day, that student is not permitted to play that day. This "full day" policy includes leaving school for appointments, so students need to avoid scheduling appointments during the school day. Additionally, students are expected to be in school for the majority of a school day in order to be eligible for practice that day. <u>Students are also expected to be on time each morning following an athletic event.</u> Students who have long standing medical appointments, family funerals to attend, or other similar instances <u>may</u> be excused at the discretion of Mr. Villers.

<u>WINTER SPORTS UPDATE</u>- We are nearing the end of the delayed winter sports season. **High School:**

The Lady Irish are currently ranked 7th in the State and have an impressive resume as they get close to sectional play. They have wins over three top ten AA schools, wins against two AAAA opponents, and a win over a top ten AAA school. The Lady Irish begin sectionals on April 14th.

The boys' basketball team is currently ranked second in the state. The Irish have been rolling recently, winning five straight. They have big wins over Notre Dame, St. Mary's, and Ravenswood. Their sectional play begins April 21st.

The swim team has had a successful season so far, and they are coming off of a winning meet as they prepare to enter Regionals. With multiple individual first place finishes so far this season, the Irish look to make a run in the postseason.

Middle School:

The boys' basketball team is currently number 1 in the conference with a 7-0 record. Unfortunately there will be no conference championship this season. The Irish are looking to end the season strong with an undefeated matchup against Westside on the horizon.

The girls' basketball team is in the top four of the conference. The Lady Irish are just coming off their biggest win of the season so far with a victory on the road vs. John Adams. The Irish only have two games remaining where they will face Elkview and East Bank.

ADDITIONAL ATHLETIC INFORMATION—Due to the pandemic shortened seasons, there is more of an overlap between winter and spring seasons than in years past. This is going to be a challenge for athletes who participate in both winter and spring sports. Athletes will still be able to participate in all the sports they would play in a normal school year. Both middle and high school athletes may participate in both seasons at the same time. The WVSSAC rule regarding winter and spring sport athletes states that if an athlete is playing a winter sport, he/she will only need to attend five spring practices to be eligible for spring sporting events. That being said, academics come first and our coaches recognize that this year's schedules will be more challenging. Please communicate with them and Mr. Nelson if time is needed for school work.

<u>VIRTUS</u> – Be sure you are able to help! All parents or other adults who volunteer, coach, drive students, chaperone, etc., are required by the Diocese to complete the diocesan sexual abuse awareness training before being allowed to work

with our students. Training is available online or at sessions periodically scheduled. To begin, visit the VirtusOnline.org and choose the online option. Allow 1- 1½ hours to complete the program. Print out the certificate of completion and submit it to Mr. Villers. It is still necessary to complete the background check and sexual abuse awareness statement which can be done by clicking on the link at the school website at www.charlestoncatholic-crw.org. If you have questions, please call Mr. Villers.

Adults who volunteer, coach, or chaperone, may be asked to update background and policy forms.

Background checks must be updated every three to five years depending on your role in the school. Policy questionnaires should be updated if they were signed before 2014. Current Diocesan guidelines do not require volunteers to update the training portion of VIRTUS. Please contact Mr. Villers with any questions and to update your forms.

CONTACT INFORMATION FOR RENWEB AND PARENT ALERT—If any of your demographic information changes or if you are not receiving weekly RenWeb emails with grade reports, please update your demographic information in RenWeb. Log in to ParentsWeb through RenWeb and update your contact information by choosing "WebForms" under "School Information." Address, phone number, and email information is located in the family demographic form. This is also where we get contact information for the Parent Alert texts that are used to communicate time sensitive and important school information (like weather related schedule changes.) Be on the lookout for these texts with important school updates including announcements from the school office. If you have questions or need assistance, please call the school office.
